One third of Mayo's rivers are failing to meet water quality standards. The principal causes are activities in hydromorphology (physical changes to habitat conditions), agriculture and forestry. Urgent action is needed to protect and restore our vital water resources.

These meetings will provide you with information on water quality in Mayo's rivers, with time for discussion on local issues. Your views on what needs to be done are important.


